Appendix C – Round Card Carrier Policy

Policy Summary Purpose

Policy

Failure to adhere to the policy

This policy provides guidelines for usage of Round Card Carriers between rounds at boxing shows sanctioned by Boxing Ontario.

To ensure that the individuals holding the round cards dress and act in a fashion that is appropriate for Boxing Ontario, competitors, and viewing audience.

- a. Boxing Ontario permits the use of individuals to carry round cards between rounds at boxing shows.
- b. The hosting club must notify Boxing Ontario in advance if Ring Card Carriers are to be used
- c. It is suggested that when round card carriers are used at corporate events, they have some relevance to the cause/fundraiser
- d. Round card carriers must wear proper attire, which may include but not limited to formal attire (i.e. tuxedos, evening gowns) or casual attire. Host clubs can check with the Regional Director or designate prior to the start of the event to confirm the appropriateness of the attire.
- e. Footwear must be appropriate for ring canvas, therefore only soft soled shoes with no heels.
- f. Round card carriers may not wear shorts (or anything above the knee), or bathing suits.
- g. The host club must follow all other guidelines as indicated in the Club Show Sanction Contract located at http://www.boxingontario.com/web_pages/forms_documents.php
- h. The Regional Director, or his/her appointee, will document on the Boxing Ontario Club Show Report any breach of the Policy.

If it is determined that a host club has violated the policy, the issue will be taken to the Director of Discipline for action and could result in further disciplinary action

The Duties of the Timekeeper are as follows:

- The main duty of the Timekeeper is to regulate the number and duration of the rounds and the intervals between rounds. The intervals between rounds must be of one (1) minute.
- The Timekeeper must start and end each round by striking the gong/ bell.
- Ten (10) seconds before the end of each round, the Timekeeper must signal the approaching end of the round.
- The Timekeeper must regulate all periods of time and counts by a watch or clock, but must only stop the clock when instructed by the Referee with the command “time” resuming after the Referee gives the command “box”.
- Following a Knockdown, the Timekeeper must give the sound signal to the Referee indicating the elapsing seconds while the Referee is counting.
- If, at the end of a round, a Boxer is knocked down and the Referee is in the course of counting, the gong/ bell indicating the end of the round must not be sounded. The gong/ bell must be sounded only when the Referee gives the command “box” indicating the continuation of the Bout.
- The Timekeeper must regulate the time when a Low Blow or LOC occurs and if a Boxer falls out of the ring.
- The Timekeeper will be seated directly at the side of the ring next to the Gong Operator.

Arrival at Event Check with Host

Check ring specifications

- Dimensions (surface, ropes, ropes to edge of platform, 16, 18 -> 20x20)
- Padding (1/2 to 3/4 inch thick)
- Quality of Surface (no tears)
- Tie downs on all sides

Ring Supplies

- 2 pails (1 for each corner)
- Disinfectant/Hand sanitizer
- Towels in corner for wiping up spills on ring
- AIBA approved gloves in good condition if supplied by Host

Competition

Check athletes equipment(double check while referee examines each athlete)

- AIBA approved headgear and gloves – and appropriate size for the bout and athlete.
- Proper uniform
- Mouth guard (no red color)



Match Guidelines for Boxing Ontario Club Shows & Tournaments

****Weight, Age and Experience must be considered before Matching**

AGE ALLOWANCES

- Junior A (Cadet) vs Junior A - (11 – 12 yr olds) - No Restrictions
- Junior A vs Junior B - 24 month age difference allowed
- Junior B vs Junior B - (13- 14 yr olds) – No Restrictions
- Junior B vs Junior C - 24 month age difference allowed
- Junior C vs Junior C - (15 – 16 yr olds) - No Restrictions
- Junior C vs Youth (Junior) - 24 month age difference allowed
- Youth vs Youth – (17-18 yr olds) – No Restrictions
- Youth vs Elite (Senior) – Youth must have reached his /her 17th Birthday
- Masters 40 yrs of age or over may only box opponent 5 yrs older/ younger by birth date
- Masters 41 – 45 - 5 calendar yr difference between Elite (Senior) at Provincial Events only

WEIGHT ALLOWANCES.... ****When not in the Same Weight Class****

MALE Youth and Senior

- Boxers under 52 kg (114.4 lbs).....3 kg (6.6 lbs) difference allowed
- Boxers over 52 kg (114.4 lbs) to 69 kg (151.8 lbs).....4 kg (8.8 lbs) difference allowed
- Boxers over 69 kg (151.8 lbs) to 91 kg (200.2 lbs).....6 kg (13 lbs) difference allowed
- Both boxers over 91 kg (201 lbs).....No maximum weight difference

FEMALE Youth and Senior

- Boxers under 60 kg (132 lbs).....3 kg (6.6 lbs) difference allowed
- Boxers over 60 kg (132 lbs) to 69 kg (151.8 lbs).....4 kg (8.8 lbs) difference allowed
- Boxers over 69 kg (140.8 lbs) to 81 kg (178.2 lbs).....6kg (13 lbs) difference allowed
- Both boxers over 81 kg (178.2 lbs)No maximum weight difference

MALE AND FEMALE JR A B C

- Boxers under 54 kg (118.8 lbs).....3 kg (6.6 lbs) difference allowed
- Boxers over 54 kg (118.8 lbs) to 66 kg (145.2 lbs).....4 kg (8.8 lbs) difference allowed
- Boxers over 66 kg (145.2 lbs) to 80 kg (200.2 lbs).....5 kg (11 lbs) difference allowed
- Both boxers over 91 kg (201 lbs).....No maximum weight difference

MASTERS (EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 2013)

- Boxers all weight classes 4.5kg (9.9) difference allowed



EXPERIENCE ALLOWANCES

- Novice vs Novice.....Maximum 7 bout difference
- Novice vs Open.....Maximum 5 bout difference
- Open vs Open.....No limit, each competitor's experience considered

8 COUNTS

- Elite(Senior)Open Male3 in a round, unlimited in the bout (maximum 7)
- All others Open Categories3 in a round, maximum 4 in the bout
- All Novice Categories 2 in a round, maximum 3 in a bout
- All exhibition bouts.....1 in the bout

ROUNDS

- Elite (Senior) and Youth Open 3 x 3
 - Elite (Senior) and Youth Open Female4 x 2
 - Jr C Male and Female.....3 x 2

Boxers may box less than allowed rounds but not more

For all boxers except Masters the length of rounds is determined by the lowest age classification of boxers in the match

In Master the length of rounds is determined by the highest age classification of the boxers

At Club Shows

Gloves – 10 oz for all for all regular bouts with Sr., Y, and Jr. Boxers
 16 oz for all exhibition bouts
 16 oz for all bouts involved master boxers.

Headgear is mandatory for all bouts.



MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL PROMOTIONS

Ensure the following are adhered to:

- ✿ All event communication and promotions clearly indicates that the event is SANCTIONED BY BOXING ONTARIO

MANDATORY REQUIREMENTS FOR WEIGH-IN & MEDICALS

The following are key requirements at the weigh ins and medicals

- ✿ Ensure the location is private so that no spectators or onlookers are present.
- ✿ Warm up rooms are NOT used as change rooms or weigh in rooms.
- ✿ Ensure that the facility has sufficient space/rooms and is sanitary and void of hazards so that the medicals can be conducted with safety and confidentiality.
- ✿ Ensure weigh in schedule is communicated to all coaches, athletes and Chief Official
- ✿ Ensure the weigh in are conducted without the presence of athlete of the opposite sex
- ✿ Ensure the club show coordinator is the ONLY one in contact with the Supervisor.
- ✿ Weigh in and medicals must occur no more than 2 hours before the event is scheduled to begin

MANDATORY ADDITIONAL PERSONNEL

The following persons are recommended for all club shows and tournaments

- ✿ Glovers - to be registered with Boxing Ontario
- ✿ Security – A safety precaution for the running of the event and crowd control.

MANDATORY ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- ✿ Providing refreshments and snacks to the officials (judges) during their involvement at the event
- ✿ Ensuring that any music played has no foul language, racist/sexist lyrics, and is appropriate for all audiences including children and families.
- ✿ Ensure that all event staff and volunteers – including ring card holders- are dressed appropriately for all audiences. Lingerie, swimwear or sexually suggestive attire is not appropriate for Boxing Ontario events.
- ✿ Submit to Boxing Ontario a DVD and/or Club Show results and Report within 5 business days of the event.

NEW RULES

Age Classification

- Elite Boxers 19 - 40 years
- Youth Boxers 17-18 years
- Junior Boxers 15 -16 years
- The boxers age is determined by year of birth

AOB RULES (II)

- The annual Medical Certification must be submitted online through the AIBA Database yearly.
- Medical Bout Report after KO and TKO
- Ringside Doctor recommends how many rest days should be prescribed or the protective measures.

AIBA rules

3 Coaches:

- 2 Coaches may mount the apron of the ring
- 1 Coach of the 2 may enter the ring
- 1 Coach on the floor

- **WEIGH-IN:**
- **General Weigh-in:**
- The Boxer's weight must not exceed the maximum nor the minimum of the Boxer's Weight Category. **No Tolerance.**

- **Daily Weigh-in:**
- Only the maximum weight limit will be controlled

AOB Gloves

Elite Men

- 10 oz = 49 kg - 64 kg
- 12 oz = 69 kg - +91 kg

All other categories (Women/Youth/Junior)

- 10oz for all weight categories

Scoring system- I

- The new Scoring System is as per current WSB Scoring System: 'Ten Points Must System'
- Until May 31 and when the Electronic Scoring System becomes defective, the Judges shall use Scorecards to score the points.

Scoring System - II

Judges' selection

- **Electronic Scoring System:**

When starting the bout, the Computer randomly selects 3 Judges out of 5 and reveals this information with the official decision of the bout.

- **Manual Scoring System**

The scoring system will be operated with 3 judges. The scores of the 3 judges will be considered.

Scoring system III

Manual Scoring System - Referee

- At the end of each round, the Referee shall connect all 3 Score cards and delivers to the Supervisor.
- The Referee should wait a couple of seconds to get the Scorecards. He should avoid crossing the ring.

Scoring System - IV

Judge:


- At the end of each round the Judges must determine the winner of the round.
- It is mandatory, one Boxer must receive ten(10) and the opponent nine (9) or less, depending on his judgement, according to the criteria.
- Every round must have a declared winner- **NO TIE.**

Scoring system VII

Tie

- Round – cannot remain a Tie
- Bout – Judge – Maybe tied at the end of the bout
- Bout – Result – Cannot remain a Tie

Scoring system VIII

Electronic System

- Flashing lights on the Score Pad, indicating a tie breaker situation.

Manual System

- When using Scorecards, on the last round, the judge must indicate the winner of the bout in case of a tie.

Scoring system IX

- Example 1 – Tie bout:

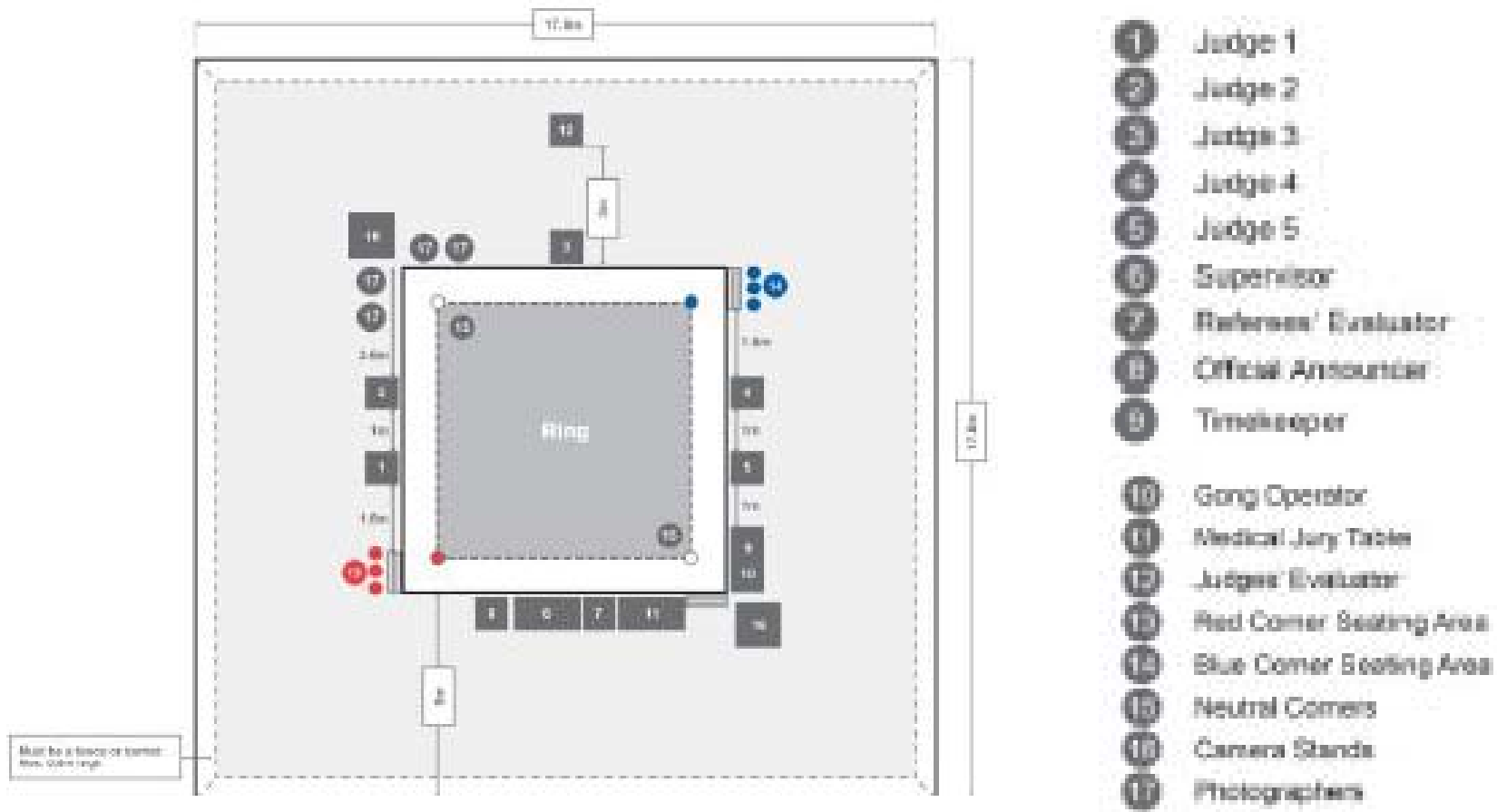
Scoring System X

Tie bout – Electronic system:

- A judge shall declare the winner of the bout by tie breaker of one of the following three cases occurs:
 - a) 1 judge – Tie and 2 judges declare different winners
 - b) 2 judges – Tie and 1 judge declares winner
 - c) 3 judges – Tie

- If one of these cases occurs, the score pad will flash a light, asking the Judge to choose the boxer in the red corner or the Blue corner as the winner.

DECISIONS-I

- Points - WP
- ~~Technical Draw - TD (only APB and WSB)~~
- Technical Knock-out - TKO
- Technical Knock-out - Out injury – TKO-1
- Disqualification - DQ
- Knock-Out - KO
- Walk-Over - WO
- ~~No Contest - NC (only APB and WSB)~~

DECISIONS II

• **Points - WP(1)**

At the end of a bout, the winner shall be determined on the basis of the total score of the Judges.

➤ **Unanimous Decision:**

3 Judges appoint the same Boxer as the winner of the bout.

➤ **Split Decision:**

a) 2 Judges appoint the same Boxer as the winner and the other Judge appoints the other Boxer as the winner.

b) 2 Judges appoint the same Boxer as the winner and the other Judge declares a tie.

DECISIONS III

• Points – WP (2)

- When an Injury is caused by an Unintentional Foul:
 - AOB – After the 1st Round starts
 - ~~APB – After the 3rd Round starts~~
 - ~~WSB – After the 2nd Round starts~~
- When both Boxers are injured at the same time:
 - ABO – After the 1st Round starts
 - ~~APB – After the 3rd Round starts~~
 - ~~WSB – After the 2nd Round starts~~
- The round in which the Bout is stopped will be scored, even if it is a partial round.

DECISIONS IV

- **Points – WP (3)**
- A Bout may be terminated by the Referee due to an event that is out of the Boxer's or Referee's control, such as the destruction of the ring, the failure of the lighting supply, forces of nature and other similar unforeseen conditions. In such circumstances, the Judges will score the round for each Boxer up to the time of the termination of the Bout and the Boxer who is ahead on points will be declared the winner of the Bout on points in accordance to the Scoring System.

AOB – After the 1st Round starts

ARB and WSB – After the 3rd Round starts

- The Round in which the Bout is stopped will be scored, even if it is a partial round.

DECISIONS V

• **Technical Knock-out – TKO (1):**

- If a Boxer retires voluntarily owing to injury or not.
- The Coach throws a towel in the ring to retire his boxer.
- The Boxer fails to resume boxing immediately after the rest period between rounds.
- Is a Boxer, in the opinion of the Referee is being outclassed or is receiving excessive punishment.
- If a Boxer is unfit to continue and fails to resume boxing after a Knock Down.

DECISIONS VI

• **Technical Knock-Out – TKO (2)**

- If a Boxer doesn't recover after one(1) minute and thirty (30) seconds, in accordance with the rule concerning low blow.
- If a Boxer doesn't come back into the ring in the allowe thirty (30) seconds after this Boxer being knocked-out of the ring.
- When the Bout is stopped by the Supervisor following the advice of a Ringside Doctor.
- Third KD in one Round or Fourth KD in a Bout – Women, Youth and Juniors

DECISIONS VII

- **Technical Knock-Out Injury – TKO-I**
 - If a Boxer, in the opinion of the Referee, is unfit to continue because of a sustained or increased injury from correct punches.
 - If a Boxer becomes incapable of continuing to compete, without receiving punches.

DECISIONS VIII

• DISQUALIFICATION – DQ

- A Boxer can be disqualified for a foul or misconduct.
- An intentional foul causes an injury to a Boxer and the fouled and injured Boxer cannot continue because of the injury sustained from the intentional foul.
- The third warning will automatically disqualify the Boxer.

DECISIONS IX

• Knock-Out – KO

- After a Knock-Down, if the Referee reaches the count of ten (10), the Boxer will have lost the bout by KO.
- If the Referee summons the Ringside Doctor in the ring, when a Boxer is down in case of an emergency, before the Boxer is counted out to ten.
- In the event of a Double KO occurs both Boxers will lose the bout by KO.

DECISIONS X

• **Walk Over – WO**

- When a Boxer is present in the ring fully attired for boxing and the Boxer's opponent fails to appear after having been called out by the public address system.
- In case the Supervisor knows in advance that a Boxer will not be present, he must cancel the procedure mentioned before and the Announcer will announce the official result to the public

INJURY

- **INJURY – 4 CASES**

- By LEGAL Blow - TKO-1
- By ILLEGAL Blow - DISQUALIFICATION
- Unintentional Foul – Win by Points
- Without Punch - TKO-1

Judges (I)

- 5 Judges shall be assigned to each Bout
- The computer randomly selects 3 Judges out of 5 Judges
- Until distribution of the Electronic Scoring System, AOB competitions using scoreboards are allowed with 3 Judges
- The Judge will not apply Warnings. The Supervisor does
- Every Round must have a declared winner- No tie
- Every Bout must have a declared winner – No tie

Judges II

•Duties:

- Primary duty to judge the bout according to Criteria and Rules.
- Judges should judge independently and without bias.
- Bring Referee' s attention with anything the Referee mau have noticed as loose ropes, etc. Action should be done between the rounds.
- May not speak to anyone during a bout.
- May not give any sign to a Boxer or Judge.
- May not leave seat until the decision is announced to the public.
- Shall use the Scoring System for judging.

Judges III

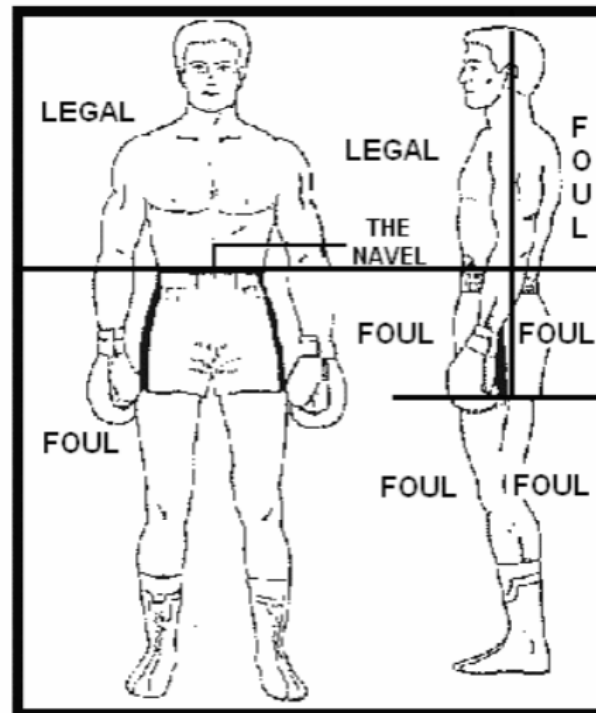
- **Criteria to award scores for boxers:**
 - 10 x 9 - Close
 - 10 x 8 - Clear winner
 - 10 x 7 - Total dominance
 - 10 x 6 - Overmatched
- Number of quality blows on the target area
- Domination of the Bout
- Competitiveness
- Technique and tactics Superiority
- Infringement of the Rules
- Consider the entire round, beginning the first second until the last second.

Judges IV

- **Legal Blow:**
 - a) Knuckle surface
 - b) Legal scoring area of body
 - c) Weight of body without infringing on a rule
 - d) Clearly connected
 - e) Must have clear vision of punch

Judges V

- Target area



Judges VI

• Tips:

- Never rely on past performance, reputations or titles earned by a particular athlete.
- Boxers who swing their blows are liable to connect the target area with the inside of the glove
- Considerable proportions of swinging blows do not contact with the knuckle part of the closed glove, and are therefore foul blows. Judge must not award points.

Judges VII

- **Tips (2):**

- Infighting may be described as the exchange of several blows when the Boxers are close together.
- The judges need to consider the combination blows.
- **DO NOT** give credit for blows delivered while the Boxer is infringing the rules.

Judges VIII

• **Tips (3):**

- Award your points for the boxing you see, not for what a Boxer can do, or has done on other occasions.
- **DO NOT** be influenced by the crowd or by the corners.
- **DO NOT** engage in conversations or other distractions during the contest. You need absolutely concentration.
- Give your undivided attention to the competing Boxers.
- Be prepared to advise the Referee if needed.

Referees I

- **Duties (1):**

- Primary Duty: To care for both boxers and make the health of both Boxers his primary concern throughout the Bout.
- To see that the rules and fair play are strictly observed.
- To maintain control of the contest at all its stages.
- To prevent a weak Boxer from receiving undue and unnecessary punishment.

Referees II

- **Duties (2):**
 - When the Referee has disqualified a Boxer or stopped the Bout, the Referee shall first inform the Supervisor which Boxer has been disqualified or the reason for which the Bout was stopped.
 - The Referee may consult the Ringside Doctor in respect of any injury to a Boxer.

Referees III

• Duties (3):

To use four words of command:

- **“STOP”** when calling for a temporary stop and when ordering boxers to stop boxing.
- **“BOX”** when ordering the boxers to begin or continue boxing.
- **“BREAK”** when breaking a clinch, upon which command each Boxer shall step back before continuing to box
- **“TIME”** when the Referee needs to interrupt the Bout for a longer period (in this case, the time keeper stops the watch).

Referees IV

- **Authorities (1):**
 - To terminate a contest at any stage if the Referee considers it to be one-sided.
 - To terminate a contest at any stage if one of the Boxers has received an injury and the Referee decides the Boxer should not continue.
 - To terminate a contest at any stage if the Referee considers the Boxers are not in earnest. In such cases, the Referee may disqualified one or both Boxers.

Referees V

- **Authorities (2):**
 - To caution a Boxer or administer a warning to a Boxer against fouls or for any other reason in the interest of fair play, or to ensure compliance with these rules.
 - To disqualify a Boxer who fails to comply immediately with the Referee's command, or behaves towards the Referee in an offensive or aggressive manner at any time.

Referees VI

- **Authorities (3):**
 - With or without previous warning, to disqualify a Boxer for committing a serious foul.
 - To interpret these Rules insofar as they are applicable or relevant to the Bout or to decide and take action on any circumstances of the Bout which is not covered by these Rules.

Referees VII

• **During a bout: Movement and Positioning**

- Neutral, easy and calm.
- Strive for the right distance between yourself and the boxers.
- Stay alert
- Shortening your distance when:
 - Difficult and tough bouts
 - Boxers infighting
 - Ability of one boxer is in doubt
 - Boxers moving towards/fighting on ropes
 - There is a good deal of noise
 - Sounds signalling that ten(10) seconds are left in the round.

Referees VIII

• Fouls:

Has to decide about the following:

- Accidental or Intentional foul?
- Type of foul
- Point deduction?
- Possible disqualification?
- Continuation bout or not?

You don't always have to call time; do it especially for potentially harmful and unsafe situations.

Referees IX

- **Fouls: Accidental**

- Immediately declare accidental foul
- Call time and Ringside Doctor if necessary
- Concussive head injury fouls

- **Fouls: Intentional**

- Immediately declare intentional foul
- Automatic point deduction
- Consider disqualification
- Concussive head injury fouls

Referees X

• **Tips (1):**

- Avoid saying Stop or Break too often, unless it is because of a Head Butt.
- After the verbal command of “**Break**”, it may be necessary to use the hands to touch and separate the Boxers.
- At the end of the round, call “**Stop**” and wait for the Boxers to retire to their corners.

Do not turn your back on the Boxers, but move to the center of the ring, turn and back into the corner.

Referees XI

• Tips (2)

- The Referees have the great responsibility to avoid cuts, injuries and concussions.
- Take care with the clashing of the heads.
- Caution or Warn Boxers for Head Butting.
- In case of an accidental clash of heads, allow one or both boxers to recover, then continue the bout without standing 8-count, only Caution the two Boxers.

Referees XII

- Right to check the Judges
- Right to check the Ringside Doctors
- Ask the Supervisor if it is allowed to start the Bout
- Signal to the Timekeeper to sound the gong and start the bout

Referees XIII

- **Center Ring Instructions**

- Short and to the point
- Confirm Authority

- **Careful with the Heads**

- Establish Waistlines
- Bout Specific Concerns

Referees XIV

- **Tips (4):**

Distinguish between 'Infighting' and 'clinching'

A clinch occurs when one or both Boxers lead and for a moment their arms become locked together:

- This is not an offence
- Offence does occur when a Boxer does not make an attempt to disengage from the clinch and continues to hold

Referees VX

- **Tips (5):**
 - The Referee should avoid walking backwards as much as possible, he should move in a forward direction the majority of the time
 - Do not give the command '**BREAK**' too quickly or too often
 - '**BREAK**' order should be given when the Boxers are slow in getting out of a clinch
 - At the command '**BREAK**', insist that BOTH boxers take a full step backwards

LOW BLOW

- **After a low blow, if the offended complains, The Referee has two(2) options:**
 - **Disqualifying** the offender immediately, if an intentional and hard blow
 - Start an **eight count**
- **After the count till eight, the Referee has two (2) options:**
 - If the Boxer **is fit** to continue: the Referee gives a **warning** to the offender, if the Referee considers necessary, and the Bout continues.
 - If the Boxer **is unfit** to continue: the Referee gives a **maximum** of up to **one minute and a half(1min.30sec.)** to recover.
- **After the above mentioned timeframe, the Referee has two (2) options:**
 - If the Boxer **is fit** to continue: the Referee applies a **warning** to the offender and the Bout continues.
 - If the Boxer **is unfit** to continue: he loses the bout by TKO. Time keeper to sound at 30, 60 and 90 second interval

Caution

- The number of Cautions given before a **warning** is issued will be at the sole discretion of the Referee.
- The Referee must use common sense when deciding how many cautions he allows before he issues a **warning**.

Knockdowns

- **Compulsory Count Limits:**

A maximum of three (3) eight counts will be given in one (1) Round.

- **Elite Men:**

- No limit of the amount of eight counts will apply in one Bout.

- **Women, Youth and juniors:**

- A maximum of four (4) eight counts will apply in one Bout.

Timekeeper

• Working with the Timekeeper:

- Sounding the bell at begin and end of round
- Control of time during the round
- Sounding last 10 seconds of the round
- Counting for knockdowns
- Control of time for \Low blow, LOC and if a boxer falls out of the ring
- Does not sound the bell if the Referee is still counting a knockdown that occur concurrent with the end of the round. Sounds the bell when the Referee says “**Box**”
- Temporarily stops the clock, when the Referee says “**Time**”
- Resumes time when the Referee says “**Box**”
- Time stoppage is not necessary when the Referee says “**Stop**”

Coaches

- The amount of Coaches is limited as follows:
 - A maximum of three (3) Coaches can accompany the Boxer to the ring.
 - Maximum of two(2) Coaches may count the apron.
 - Maximum of one(1) Coach may enter the ring.
 - One (1) coach must always remain on the floor.
